The Council is pleased to inform residents that Bob Donovan has been co-opted as a Parish Councillor. We are pleased to welcome him and are sure he will make a valuable contribution to the business of the Council.

Ann Norris Johnson has announced her retirement after many years excellent service and the Council has sent a letter of thanks and wish her well for the future. There is now a vacancy for a Parish Councillor and we are advertising for the post on the parish noticeboards.

We have completed two long running projects. The thinning of the trees in Sparable Wood has been completed and also there is a brand new, smart looking noticeboard in the middle of

Newchurch. My thanks to Carl Ryder for putting up the board as the job proved more difficult than first thought, as he had to remove large amounts of rock before he could get the posts in.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be on Tuesday, 9 May at 7.45pm at St Mary's School in Newchurch, to which all residents are welcome. I will give information on our achievements over the past year and what we hope to achieve in the next 12 months.

The Parish Council has decided to move the second noticeboard in Newchurch, currently situated outside the church, and resite it to Sabden Fold. This is using our resources to best affect and thereby not incurring extra costs. We can then advertise the PC's business to residents in Sabden Fold as well as Newchurch and Spen Brook, where noticeboards are already situated. Christopher Burt

## ROUGHLEE

**Parish Council: Monday April 3 at 7pm**

At the meeting of Parish Council on 6th March we were very pleased to welcome thirteen villagers who attended to ask questions and express views. This was great to see and something the Parish Council wishes to encourage at all future meetings.

The item of most interest related to the future of the Bay Horse. It is clear that most villagers want to see the retention of the pub which is as an important asset for both locals and visitors. Its permanent closure would be a grievous loss to the life of the village.

Two very positive things emerged from the meeting. First, it was agreed that we would seek to have the pub designated as an Asset of Community Value and this has now been approved by Pendle Borough Council. The affect of this designation is to provide greater protection against the loss of the pub and allows intervention should the owners seek to dispose of the site for another purpose. Secondly, it was decided to set up a working group of villagers who would look into possible measures to secure a viable future for the pub. This group, chaired by Paul Dawson, will be independent from the Parish Council but will work closely to achieve what is a shared ambition which is to 'Save our Bay'. To this end, on Thursday April 6 there will be a **PUBLIC MEETING** at 7.30pm in the Village Centre where more details will be discussed and investors sought.

Other, more domestic, matters included horse and dog muck on the footpath between Crow Trees and Judson Fold so the co-operation of horse riders and dog walkers

is needed to prevent an on-going problem. Nigel Brotherton reported an encouraging start to the reformed FoRA group. A successful Operation Spring Clean took place as well as the first meeting of the group. The next will be on 26th April at 7.30pm in the Village Centre and the next Clean-up day is on the 28th May at 10.30am. Please come along and get involved. Another major item relates to the Council website. This has been looked after from its inception by James Starkie and thanks for all his work in maintaining a very successful site. Changes are afoot because of new rules on transparency which mean we need to report on Parish Council activities on a much more regular basis and it needs to be much more reactive in order to give up to date information. The website has, therefore, been relaunched and will be looked after by our Clerk, Mary, and Parish Councillor Simon Cronshaw. It is now up and running so please log on to [www.roughlee.org.uk](http://www.roughlee.org.uk) to find out what is going on in the village. The opportunity is there for you to get engaged and offer feedback. Finally, the Parish Council is putting together a response to the Borough Council's consultation of the emerging Pendle Local Plan, Part 2. This consultation is an important stepping stone in looking at the future of our village through to 2030. It will affect, for example, the number of new houses which could be built and where they will be sited. If not properly controlled there could be a significant adverse impact on the character of the area. As such the Parish Council is taking the consultation very seriously and will be considering a paper on what response we should make. It is displayed on the website but this is a matter of some importance to us

all so please come along to the next Parish Council meeting and have your say. Andrew Walker

This will be for Churchwardens, PCC members and Sidespersons. It is always good to have some new members coming forward to join the PCC and the Sidespersons Rota.
